The **Mainstage Season** features four marquee-style musicals and plays directed and designed by faculty, professional artists, or advanced upperclassmen.



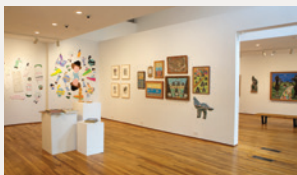
The **Second Season** includes exciting and innovative events like musical revues and cabarets, staged readings, one-act plays, and special performances.

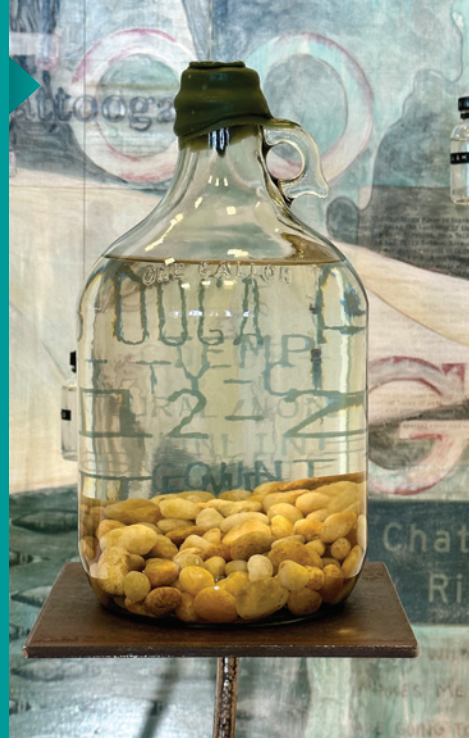

Ted Whisenhunt Exhibition “Watermarks”

The abundant rivers & streams of Southern Appalachia have shaped the landscape and the visual culture of the areas they pass through leaving old signs and creating new ones that can be interpreted by those who learn to see them. Ted Whisenhunt has been exploring these rivers and streams and learning to see them from new perspectives through the processes of documentation, experimentation, and interviews with people who regularly interact with these streams. Ted celebrates the rivers and streams of Southern Appalachia and highlights individuals who interpret and decode the often-overlooked visual cues embedded in these logic systems. Ted hopes to gain a better understanding of river signs, and to build community through his design practice and experimentation. By talking with others about their experiences and associations with rivers and streams, he became more aware of the many layers of information that can be “seen” or “unseen” to the casual passerby. This collection of essays, data, artwork and design experiments exposes cultural connections and environmental issues facing these streams today while celebrating individuals and communities who endeavor to protect these invaluable resources that many take for granted.

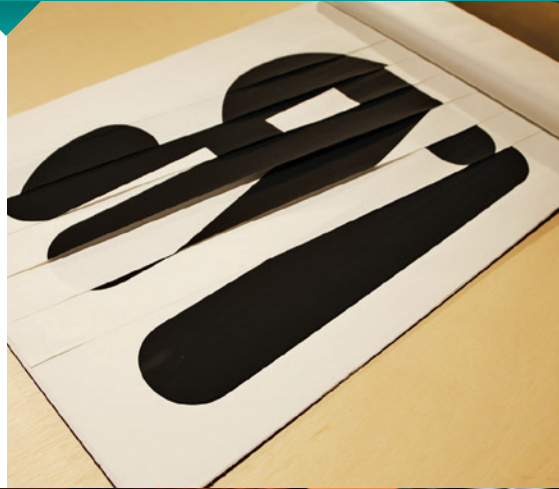
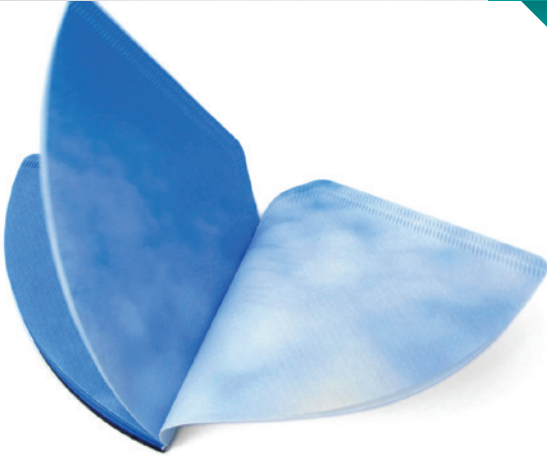

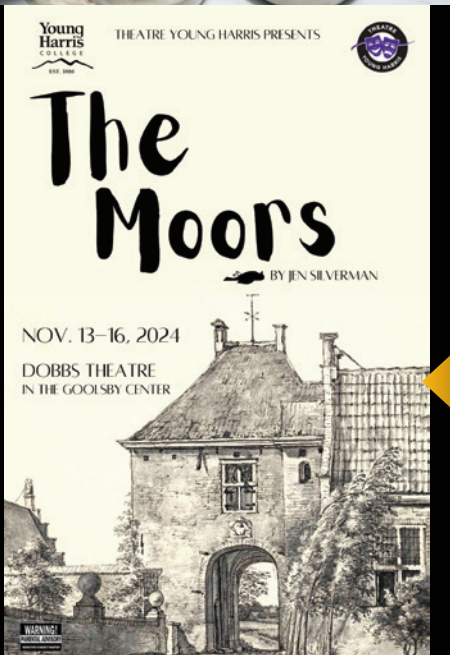
11/4 YHC Concert Band

11/7-1/24 Thaddeus Erdahl and Stephanie Stuefer Art Exhibition

Deeply inspired by his father's art, Thaddeus' work speaks of the interconnectedness of past and present and the beauty found in the passage of time. It captures erosion and growth in a single piece, inviting viewers to contemplate the enigmatic nature of life itself. Stephanie works with clay as both a sculptural medium and utilitarian material. Her current utilitarian body of work was originally designed for her husband's coffee roasting venture, Zagg's Coffee. The "zig zag" lines of the mug forms set into motion a broader body of work for this show.



11/13-16 The Moors by Jen Silverman

Two sisters and a dog live out their lives on the bleak English moors, dreaming of love and power. The Moors is a dark comedy about love, desperation, and visibility, a satirical take on the Brontë sisters' gothic musings. The play explores themes of love, identity, power, and toxic relationships, and some say it reveals important social and sexual politics for women in the United States. **Rated PG-13, contains sexual themes and potential simulated violence. Viewer discretion is advised.**

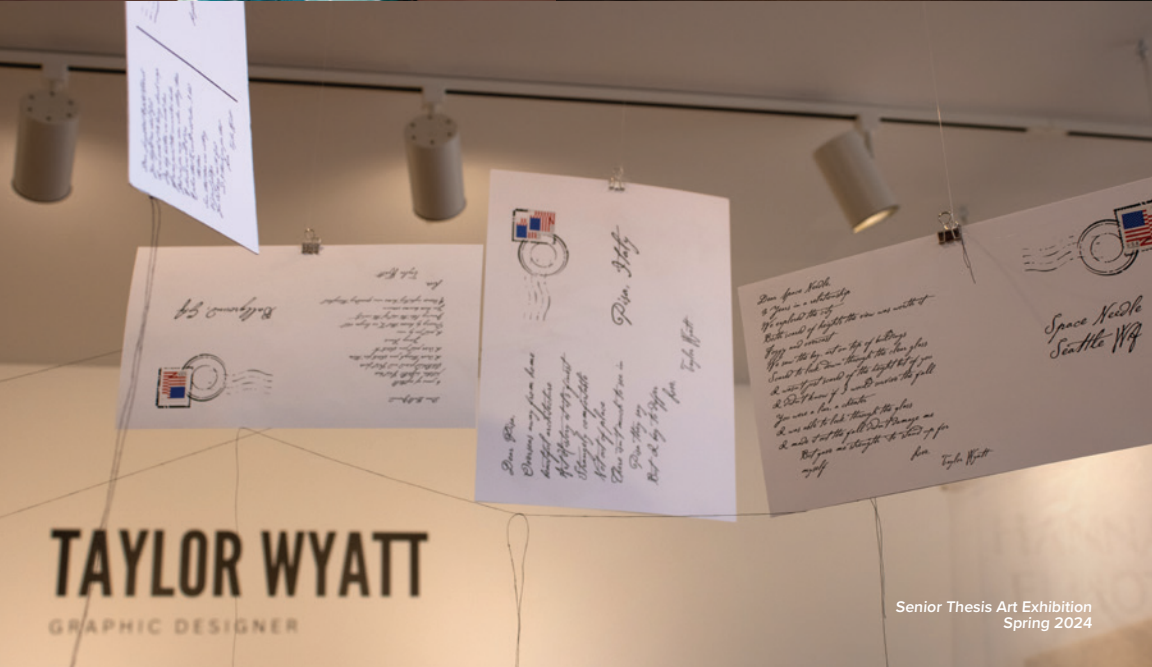
